The Tech student body deeply appreciates the hard work and dedication of those who organized this year's 49er's.



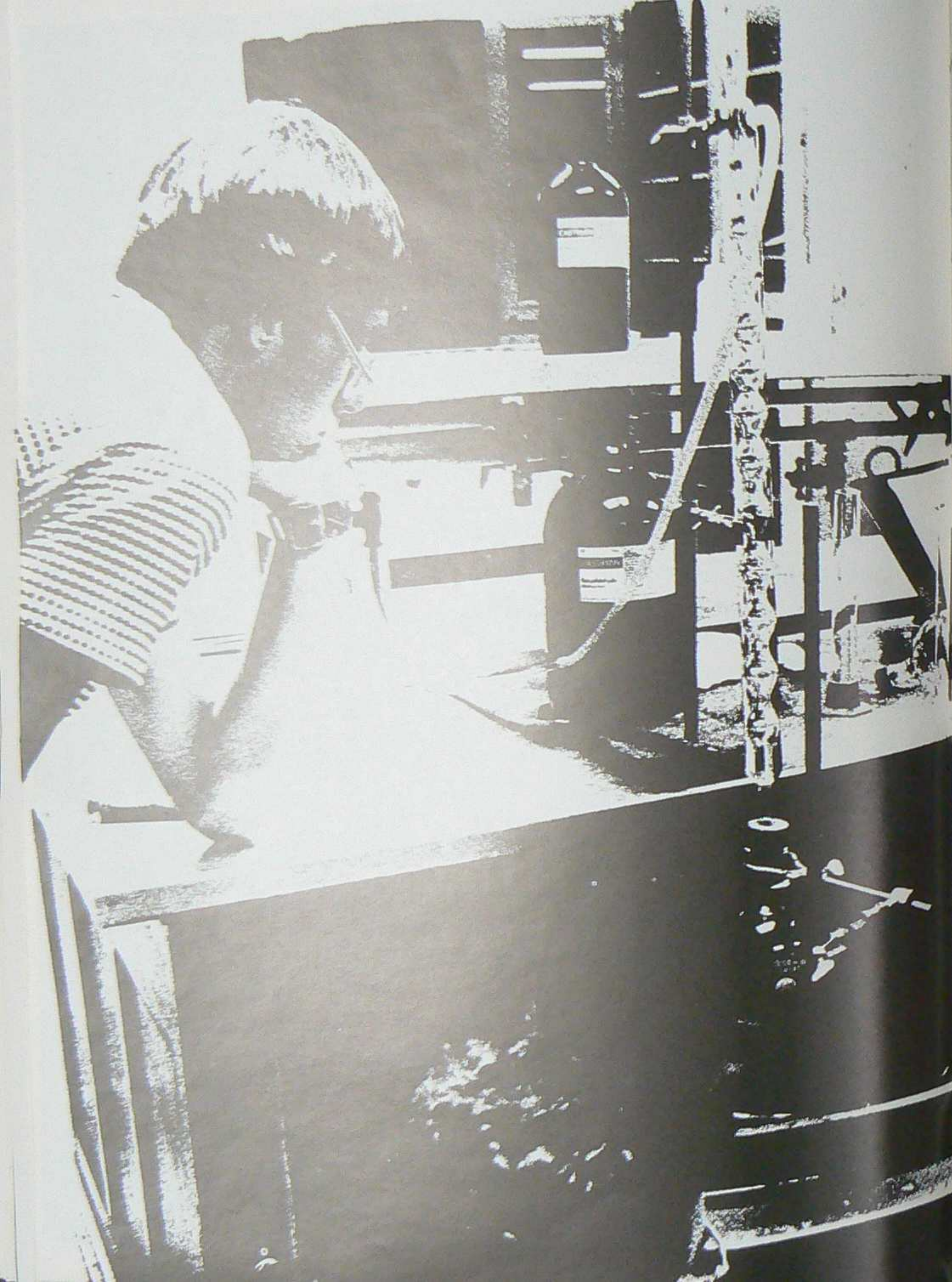
